Materials

- yarn (samples from Alpina “Anabel”)
- filler
- sewing yarns
- 2 beads for eyes
- Hook and sewing needle
- tailor’s pins

Abbreviations

- AR – Amigurumi Magic ring
- MR – Amigurumi Magic ring
- 3in1 – crochet 3 columns in one loop
- sc : Single Crochet

inc : Increase

dec : Decrease

tr : Triple Crochet/ Treble Crochet

st: Stitch

dc : Double Crochet

hdc: Half Double Crochet

sl-st or Slst: Slip Stitch

ch : Chain

tch: Turnin chain crochet

..in : make increase into same stitch as many as the number which is given in front of “inc” abbreviation (exp; 3inc, 4inc..).

FLO : Crochet into front loops only

BLO : Crochet into back loops only

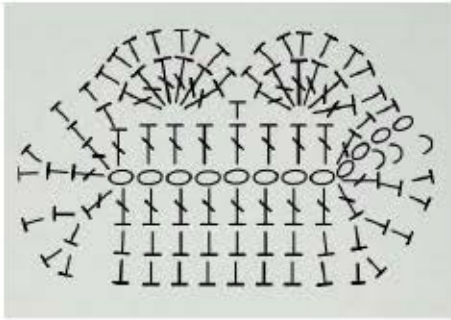

 6 Rnd: (4sc 1inc) x 6 (36)
 7 Rnd: (5sc 1inc) x 6 (42)

 8 Rnd: (13sc 1inc) x 3 (45)
 9 Rnd: (14sc 1inc) x 3 (48)
 10 Rnd: (15sc 1inc) x 3 (51)
 11 – 16 Rnd: 51sc
 17 Rnd: (16sc 1inc) x 3 (54)
 18 Rnd: 54sc
 19 Rnd: (17sc 1inc) x 3 (57)
 20 – 21 Rnd: 57 sc

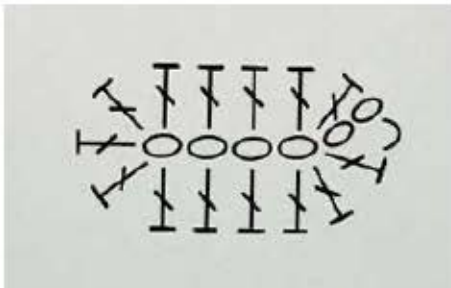
22 Rnd: (17sc 1dec) x 3 (54)
 23 Rnd: (7sc 1dec) x 6 (48)
 24 Rnd: (6sc 1dec) x 6 (42)
 25 Rnd: (5sc 1dec) x 6 (36)
 26 Rnd: (4sc 1dec) x 6 (30)
 27 Rnd: (3sc 1dec) x 6 (24)
 28 Rnd: (6sc 1dec) x 3 (21)
 29 – 31 Rnd: 21sc
 32 Rnd: (6sc 1inc) x 3 (24)
 33 – 34 Rnd: 24 sc
 35 Rnd: (7sc 1inc) x 3 (27)
 36 Rnd: (8sc 1inc) x 3 (30)
 37 Rnd: 30sc
 38 Rnd: (9sc 1inc) x 3 (33)
 39 – 40 Rnd: 33sc
 41 Rnd: (9sc 1dec) x 3 (30)
 42 Rnd: (3sc 1dec) x 6 (24)
 43 Rnd: (2sc 1dec) x 6 (18)
 44 Rnd: (1sc 1dec) x 6 (12)



Muzzle



Tummy



Beak

1 Rnd: 10ch close in a ring
2 Rnd: 10dc



Wings

– 2 parts

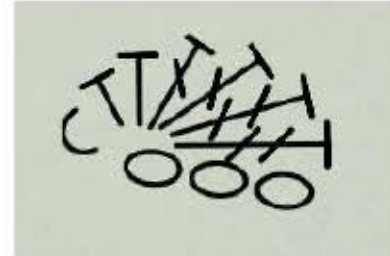
1 Rnd: 8ch

2 Rnd: 6dc

Tie the ends of the thread with a knot

Paws

– 2 parts



Assembly

For convenience, we first fix all the details with tailor's pins.

Then we sew.

When sewing on the beak, we fix it in the required shape.



Hat and scarf

The hat is knitted with stocking stitch (alternating front and back rows). The number of loops depends on the density of knitting.

I have 50 loops.

The scarf is tied with an elastic band 1×1
